EARLY HISTORY

Our first European Settlers came from Birmingham, England via the Albertland Settlement Scheme which was founded through an organisation in England that inspired one William R Brame to be the prime-mover in the formation of a "non-conformist special colony – Albertland".

On 4 September 1863 the first European settlers of Maungaturoto arrived in Auckland and then came north via boat to Mangawhai. Bullock carts brought them as far as Kaiwaka and then by boat again to 'the Landing' behind GAS garage and Graham Slatter's Kaipara Plumbing depot.

The first part of the settlement started in that area. The first school and churches were situated around Griffins Road and Gorge Road area about one kilometre away from the Medical Centre corner.

A yearly subscription of \$75 per family will assure you of emergency ambulance transportation to the nearest hospital. The charge for non ambulance members for an ambulance trip is at least \$55 per time.

THINGS TO SEE AND DO

Maungaturoto Monthly Markets

Maungaturoto Playground & Park

The playground and park are situated in Hurndall Street in the centre of town. The children's playground is well equipped, and the park is an appealing place for picnics and games. There are public toilets nearby.

Piroa Falls

This is a popular attraction situated on Gorge Road (metal road for the last few kilometres) with a pleasant walk developed by Rotary and DOC to the falls through the bush. The falls are spectacular and there is a good picnic spot. It is suitable for swimming and is excellent entertainment for the kids in the summer months.

Nikau Grove

This is situated on Whaka Street beside St David's Presbyterian Church. It is very pretty and is one of the few naturally-occurring stands of Nikau palm trees in New Zealand.

Collins Bush Scenic Reserve

Community Walkway

Maungaturoto has its own Community Walkway which features open farm land and small bush sections. The walkway entrances are located at the Country Club and near the carpark at Otamatea High School. All residents are welcome to use this walkway however the walkway is closed during lambing season (which is about a month).

Whakapirau

Whakapirau is a little beach settlement on the Kaipara Harbour, only 15kms from Maungaturoto; the road is sealed all the way there. It is suitable for swimming and for all types of water sports. There are no shops at Whakapirau but there is a church and a tennis court.

Pahi

The beach settlement of Pahi is approximately 18kms from Maungaturoto also on a sealed road (go through Paparua then turn off to the left). There is a camping ground and playground at Pahi and also a small dairy. The largest Morton Bay fig tree in NZ grows there which offers a lot of shade in the hot summer months. Pahi is good for most types of water sports and swimming.
